In the pamphlet "Don't be Brainwashed", distributed by THE STATE SOVEREIGNTY COMMISSION and THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON SEGREGATION, there are 6 things they ask you to do. They are fighting for us; we should join ranks with them. This is what they say you can do: 1. Resist all attempts of subversive groups to brainwash you into believing that all is lost, that we now have no choice in the matter, that integration is inevitable. 2. Write to our U.S. Senators and Congressmen and ask them to initiate legislation to limit federal encroachment on states' rights. 3. Let your Governor and other state officials know that you are behind them in their fight for segregated schools. 4. Organize local groups and committees to support the fight to keep our state in control of our public schools. 5. Let the President, members of the U.S. Supreme Court and other federal officials know how you feel. 6. Keep up your courage-- never give up in our fight for the American Way of Life.

We can well be proud of Governor Jimmie Davis, Superintendent Shelby Jackson, the majority of the State Legislators and other state officials, who are trying to stop the engulfing tide of socialistic, federal encroachment on states' rights. It's too bad that the City Administration and "surrender four" School Board members have taken the opposite stand and are opposing and hindering the Legislature, and in fact, have adopted the "inevitable" doctrine advanced by the socialists.

Present events in Louisiana will make history. Will law prevail, or the whim of the federal judges predicated on personal opinions of "social scientists"? In the decision handed down by the three-judge federal court in New Orleans, November 30, 1960, it is the peculiar reasoning of the court that it looks to the intent of all laws passed by the Louisiana Legislature, and declares them unconstitutional because of "intent". Yet the basis of their opinion is the Black Monday decision of the supreme court which stated that the judges could not turn back the clock to consider the intent of the Fourteenth Amendment. The supreme court rested its case, not on the Constitution or judicial precedent, but on sociological studies written by a hard core of Communist sympathizers. Is this the "law of the land" from which the federal court says the people, through their legislature, have no recourse? Federal courts have taken away the right of the state to control its system of education, its right and duty to keep peace and order in the state, and have substituted communistic sociological studies for the Constitution of the United States. Destruction of our educational system is the aim of the communists.

After the mothers' march on November 15th, protesting integration in McDonogh 19 and Frantz schools, the news media did a scurrilous job of false reporting and distorting facts. The march was a peaceful demonstration, but the press and other news media chose to ignore the presence of the parents, in fact, deliberately refrained from showing any pictures or evidence that parents were present (from 300 to 500 is the estimate of mothers in the march--about 4 blocks long). Instead, they characterized the demonstration as a teenage mob, violent and destructive, which had to be dispelled by police cordons and firehoses for the protection of the city.

The Citizens' Council takes this opportunity of expressing its sincere thanks and appreciation for the dedicated and untiring work of many of its members who have substantially contributed to the successful boycott of the Frantz and McDonogh 19 Schools and who have assisted parents who did not wish to submit their children to forced racial integration in finding education elsewhere for the children of these two schools.

**THESE ARE THE PRESENT RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS FOR
REGISTRATION IN LOUISIANA:**

- 1 year in the State
- 6 months in the Parish
- 3 months in the Precinct
- (4 months in the City, to vote in municipal elections)

THIS IS THE PRESENT REGISTRATION PROCEDURE IN LOUISIANA:

1. You are required to register without any help. The Registrar has instructions to exclude all but the applicants from the Registration Office.
2. You are required to identify yourself. Your identification should bear your present address. Acceptable identifications are drivers' licenses, current telephone or electricity and gas bills, school or employment I.D. cards, bank books, rent receipts, time-payment cards, etc.
3. When the Registrar gives you the affidavit form (Form No. 11), you are required to sign it where indicated.
4. On the same Form No. 11, you read a part of the *Preamble of the U. S. Constitution* and write a line from it, as directed by the Registrar.
5. Next, you choose 1 of 10 cards that will be turned face down by the Registrar. He will circle the number of your card on Form No. 11. Each card bears 6 questions, which are numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6. Under each number there are "a," "b," and "c" answers, one of which is the correct answer to the question.
6. You choose your answer, but are not allowed to write on the question card. You circle the letter of the answer you have chosen on Form No. 11. You are required to answer 4 of the 6 questions correctly, but may answer 5 or 6 questions if you prefer.
7. You will have completed Form No. 11 when you have filled in your parish, the date, your signature (according to the Registrar's instructions, if you are a married woman), your Ward and Precinct (which the Registrar will give you), and your address.
8. Now, the Registrar lets you choose 1 of 5 Application Forms. These 5 cards are not different in content; they are different only as to the order in which the information is requested.
9. At the bottom of this Application form and on the back of the card are the 6 character and moral questions. To answer these, you are required to strike out either the "have" or the "have not," either of which may come first on any question.
10. BE SURE TO FILL IN EVERY BLANK.

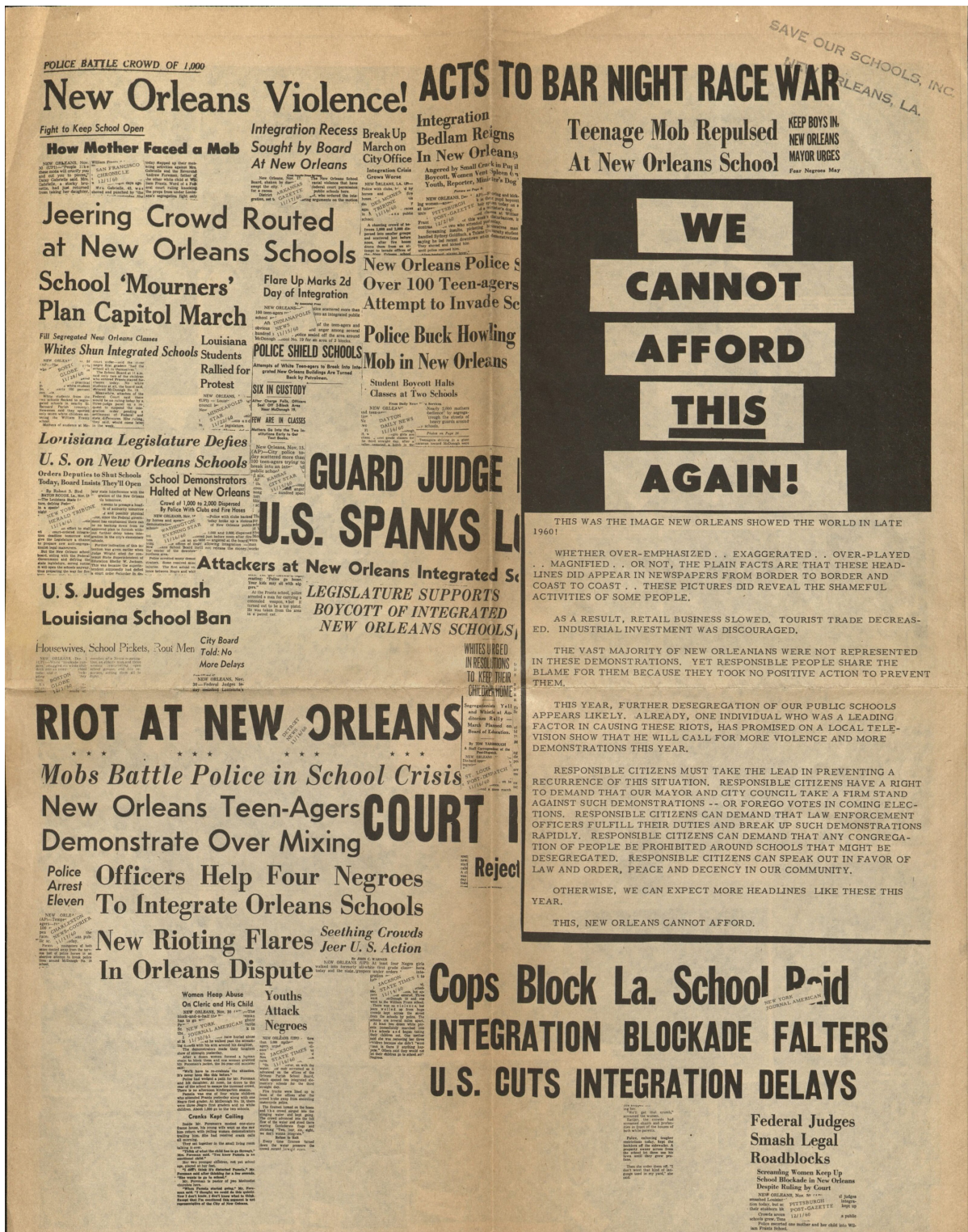

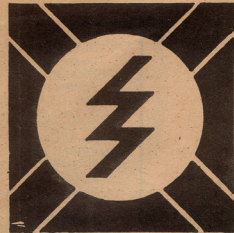

Kennedy Suppresses Truth

There has been so much controversy over the Blauvelt Genealogy which is available to the general public in the Library of Congress that it became too much for the Kennedy family. On May 14th Bobby Kennedy arrogantly sent his Justice Department agents over to the Library of Congress and removed these revealing documents. Actually he had no authority to make such a shocking move. Every document in the Library of Congress belongs to the American People. These documents are for public consumption and cannot in any way be classified 'secret'. Yet, the President's brother takes it upon himself to remove this book exposing his brother's first wife. As late as June 19, the chief of the Photoduplication Service in the Library of Congress, Mr. Donald C. Holmes has been issuing form letters refusing to send photo copies of page 884 of the Blauvelt Genealogy. He uses the excuse that the Blauvelt Genealogy material is 'defamatory' and 'THE MATTER IS THAT IT IS IMPOSSIBLE FOR HIM TO MAKE COPIES BECAUSE THE GENEALOGY HAS BEEN LEGALLY REMOVED FROM THE LIBRARY. He is simply covering up, on direct orders from the

Kennedy. It has been reported to this office that the 'Saturday Evening Post' once carried an article mentioning Kennedy's first marriage. The Kennedy family got wind of it before press time and moved in and forced the removal of this material from the Post. Other articles were then quickly substituted in its place. Kennedy's agents have been going up and down the country side stealing records, destroying society columns in Oyster Bay which mentioned the wedding, perhaps their agents have now destroyed the divorce records. But truth will win out. The Kennedy's refuse to make a public statement on this matter. It is possible that once they feel enough records have been destroyed, and the past history of Kennedy's life has been rewritten, they will then be in a position to issue a denial. But their great fear is in not knowing just what new big of evidence we will come up with next. There must be witnesses, and others with first hand knowledge. We will keep searching, and all our readers are themselves investigators, the hunt goes on. The Kennedy image is now on a very shaky pedestal.

First Wife Evades All Questions

Durie Malcom has been contacted numerous times by phone. She refuses to either admit, nor deny the divorce story. The same with John F. Kennedy. They seem

to feel that if they can maintain silence, along with their enforced press control, that these stories will eventually die out.

Kennedy Divorce News Bulletins

CONGRESSMAN CHARLES A. HALL: "This statement has been circulated in Washington for several months and pretty thoroughly checks out, but no one has been able to document it."

Issue #42 of "The Thunderbolt" was the first newspaper in America to break the Kennedy divorce story into print. Since that time four other newspapers have had the courage to print it. "The Thunderbolt" let the Kennedy skeleton out of the closet and the dust hasn't settled yet. We have received long distance phone calls from all over America for more information. Daily newspapers have contacted us, as well as three calls from U.P.I. Much more is known now and the story is still breaking fast. Here are the latest news items:

- 1) John F. Kennedy reportedly married Durie Malcom in Oyster Bay, Mass., in March of 1940.
- 2) After their divorce she married Mr. Thomas Shevlin. She has been living in Palm Beach and Long Island. (The property they now live on in Palm Beach is owned by Joseph P. Kennedy - the President's father.)
- 3) She refuses to discuss the divorce with reporters. No one is allowed to bring the question up at Kennedy's press conferences.
- 4) Compilers of the Blauvelt Genealogy refuse to talk.
- 5) On Monday, May 21st (after "The Thunderbolt" exclusive hit the streets) Bobby Kennedy sent Justice Department agents to the Library of Congress where they removed the now famous "Blauvelt Genealogy." (Photostat appears on this page, made before the Kennedy family began burning books and destroying documents. STATEMENT BY PIERRE SALINGER.

"This is for guidance, but not for publication. The listing of Durie Malcom's husbands is in incorrect order."

(Editors Comment: Mr. Salinger if you have something to say and it is not for publication - do not let "The Thunderbolt" get hold of it.) It is reported that Kennedy was her second husband and not her third. Mr. Salinger seeks to confuse the issue, without directly answering the question.

The President of the United States is our number one public official. He is one man who cannot afford to keep a scandalous past secret. The American people have the right to know all the facts about their President. We also know that Kennedy won the election only 10,000 votes. It is also a known fact that he made much of his religion which enabled him to switch many thousands of normally Republican Catholics into the Democratic column. He allows Castro to buy all the goods America refuses to sell Cuba. Without all this aid from Canada, many feel Castro would soon fall. EDITORIAL



There can be no question that Earnest Scriver Cox knows more about negro nationalism than any White man alive. For the past forty years or more Cox has worked with negroes to help them fulfill their dreams of independence and self-respect in Africa.

Besides his practical work in the field of African Repatriation he has written two books which are already recognized as timeless classics. "White America and Teutonic Unity are both out of print but Cox's friends hope to reprint them."

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE BACK-TO-AFRICA MOVEMENT
BY EARNEST SEVIER COX

PAUL CUFFE, a free Negro, was a native of Massachusetts. He was described as tall, well formed, and athletic; a man of remarkable dignity, tact, and piety. At age 47 he owned one ship, two briggs, several smaller boats, and property in houses and land. In 1811 Cuffe with a crew of Negro seamen sailed to Sierra Leone on the West Coast of Africa and made arrangements there for the reception of Negro emigrants from the United States. In 1815, Cuffe, at his own expense, carried a ship load of Negroes from Massachusetts to Sierra Leone. He died in 1817, the year in which eminent white Americans in a plan to assist Negro repatriation formed the American Colonization Society and acquired the area now known as Liberia. That country received several thousands of American Negro immigrants and has much unsettled land reserved for other American Negro immigrants.

MARCEL GARVEY without question stands as the greatest leader and the greatest organizer that the Negro race has produced. He was born in Kingston, Jamaica, 1887; died in London, England, 1940. Highly endowed with qualities that were to make him the outstanding advocate of Negro race advancement, Garvey came to the United States and organized the *Universal Negro Improvement Association*. His chief means for press publicity was the *Negro World*. Garvey spoke in terms that interpreted the Negro innermost desire for economic progress, blood integrity, and race nationality. To unify the Negroes of the world Garvey's organization became international. It developed into a far flung empire of sentiment and practical effort. Its membership is said to have reached a total of more than six million.

Garvey sought to finance his *Black Star Line* of ships to trade among Negro peoples and assist in carrying Negro emigrants to settle on the public lands of Liberia. Within the United States Garvey's ideals aroused the open hostility of the *National Association for the Advancement of Colored People*. His doctrine of "Africa for the Africans; those at home and those abroad," brought opposition from whites in high places who fear international objection to the doctrine of Africa for the Africans. Garvey was convicted by a white jury for selling what was deemed to be worthless stock in the *Black Star Line* and sentenced to five years in a Federal Penitentiary. After considerable time his sentence was commuted and he was returned to Jamaica. He could not again enter the United States. This limitation together with the hunger and destitution during the late depression led to a great lessening of his organized followers. There were other prominent Negro Nationalist leaders prior to Garvey and a number of them at present. Space does not permit details relating to these capable leaders.

The white supporters of the ideal of restoring our Negroes to their ancestral land would include the most illustrious individuals of the white race. George Washington prepared a plan—"To Return to Africa Her Stolen Children." Thomas Jefferson for 30 years pleaded for the abolition of slavery and the restoration of the Negro to the homeland of his race. Abraham Lincoln throughout his adult manhood stood for this Cause. His Emancipation Proclamation proclaimed it. Congress enacted legislation for Lincoln to institute his colonization program. James Madison, James Monroe, John Marshall, Andrew Jackson, Henry Clay, and Daniel Webster supported this Cause.

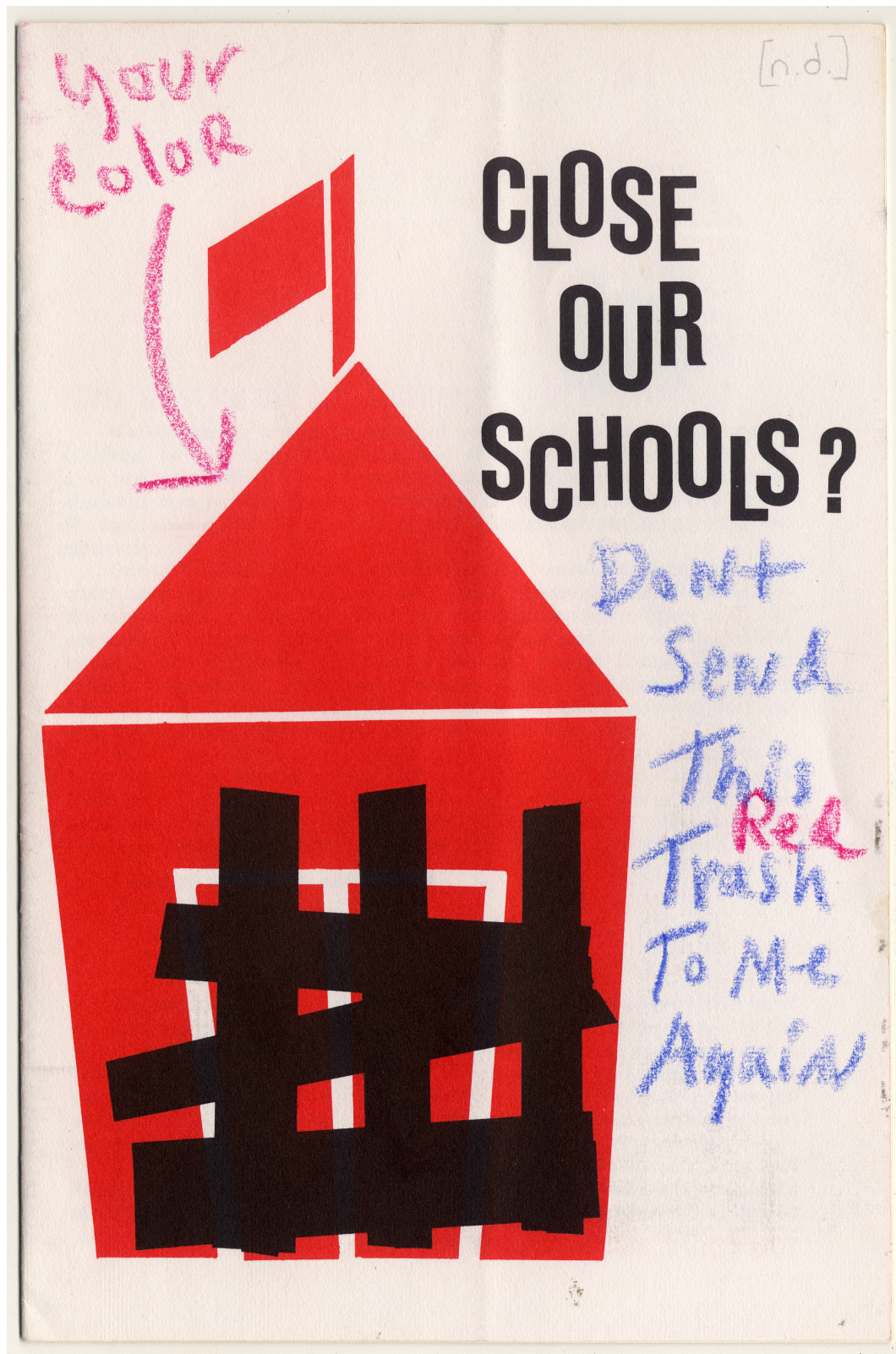
